*The Sinclair Formula is an internationally recognized system designed to figure out who is the best male or female lifter across all weight categories. The Sinclair Total is calculated by taking an athlete's Total and multiplying that number by a computed 'Sinclair Coefficient'. This coefficient is a number, dependent on the lifter's bodyweight, which is calculated by a defined mathematical process completed at the end of every Olympic Games cycle, based on the then current world records, in order to bring all Totals up to their equivalent at the top end of the highest bodyweight category. Club President and resident mathematician, Michael Noonan, applies a formula he has devised which converts the female score to its male equivalent, thus giving all members, male and female, an opportunity to win the Ian Laurie Cup.

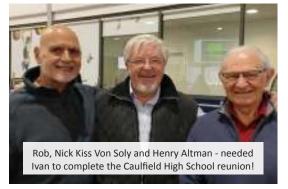

In Memoriam



Joe Brent

28 October 1942 - 17 August 2023

6-time Australian Champion; Commonwealth Games Representative (1966,1970)

Joe Brent was born in Calabria, Southern Italy, as Giuseppe Carmelo Brancatisano and arrived in Australia at 8 years of age. He began lifting in 1958 at the Revesby Community Hall and went on to win 6 Australian senior championships from 1965-1971 as a lightweight (67.5kg).

Joe excelled in the Press, having a world class personal best of 142.5kg, usually giving him a huge early lead that his competitors rarely made up in the Snatch and Clean & Jerk. Although he competed for a couple of years after, Joe's career was greatly affected by the removal of the Press from the competition program in 1972.

Joe was well known to many of our members, having attended a couple of lan Laurie Cups, and of course, our older members remember him competing. His love of weightlifting kept him active and pushing weights past 80 years of age at his friend, Olympian George Vasil's gym, in Sydney.



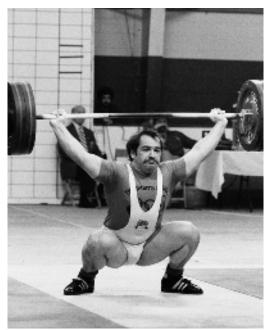
Adam Gnatov

9 September 1944 - 20 July 2023

World Record Holder; USSR Champion

Adam Gnatov set 14 world records in a career that saw him raise the Flyweight (52kg) Press record from 102.5kg in 1969 to 120.5kg in 1972. At a height of 132cm, Gnatov struggled in the Snatch, which ultimately limited his ability to represent the USSR at the highest international level, although he did win a silver medal at the 1972 European championships.

In domestic competition, Gnatov won gold medals at the 1971 USSR championships, 1971 USSR Spartakiade in 1971 and 3 USSR Cups (1970 -1972). Overall, he was a medallist at 8 USSR championships, including Press gold in 1970, 1971and Clean & Jerk gold in 1971,1972, 1974 and 1975.

James "Butch" Curry

20 February 1953 - 15 September 2023

USA Champion; Olympian

James "Butch" Curry Jr. was a larger than life figure who loved weightlifting. Butch was selected to represent the US at the 1980 Moscow Olympic Games and competed in Melbourne at our Olympic Trials that year. Unfortunately, Butch missed his opportunity to compete in Moscow due to the USA's ill conceived boycott of the Games, a bitter pill to swallow. Butch returned to Australia to compete at the 1981 SGIO Games, where he had many friends.

Butch was born in Queens, New York, and he followed his father's footsteps into the sport of weightlifting, winning a number of junior titles and ultimately the US senior national titles in 1979 and 1980 at midheavy (90kg).

Following his lifting career, Butch spent time as a technical official, coach, USAW Board member and Pacific Weightlifting Association Chairman for 19 years. He was a tireless promoter of the sport, in person and online at his OWOW! (Olympic Weightlifting On Web) lifttillyadie.com, one of the earliest websites dedicated to Olympic weightlifting.

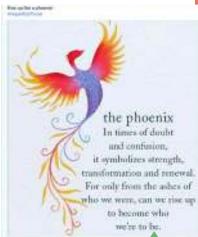

Thank you and Farewell

This year marks twenty years since the first issue of The Phoenix Independent was published - actually printed and distributed, old school style. The brainchild of Simon "Heff" Heffernan, the newsletter was warmly received by the members, and provided a few moments of humour and levity, as well as information, in what was a tough first year for the Club.

Eventually, I was given the pleasure of producing The Independent, aided and abetted by various members who came and went, over the years. Since then, the role of the newsletter, and newsletters in general, has changed and its relevance examined, particularly in today's social media environment, where information and images are almost immediately available for sharing. There's no doubt that the current product is slicker and more professional-looking, but at what cost? Has the newsletter consequently lost some of its character? Is there enough variety in the content?

As I see it, the newsletter has a dual purpose. One is to inform and, hopefully, entertain club members. The other is to promote the club to the wider community and retain the interest of former club members and supporters. This should be fulfilled online through social media and the club website, ideally by someone who has a physical presence at the club on a daily basis. Mixing with members in some capacity, getting inside stories and interests that provide a real picture of the club. I am no longer that person.

My first involvement with a club newsletter was the old Hawthorn Weightlifting Club's "Wogs Weakly", the title a cheeky retort to a derogatory remark made by a rival club's official. It was unlike any other publication at the time (first issue 1969) and contained hard to get results from interstate and international events, thanks to Paul Coffa's network, various ranking lists like All Time Club Top 40, Double Bodyweight Clean & Jerks etc, also collated by Paul. The Rover's column was a humorous inside look at members' often embarrassing moments and the monthly Editorial, usually some inspirational message but also the odd "kick in the pants" when warranted, was Sam Coffa's domain and on occasion written by my father, Gaby, who also did competition write ups.

The back page featured multiple cartoons of members, usually of lifts from various competitions and personal best training lifts - no photos in those days! The newsletter was produced once a month by hand (google "Gestetner machine" and stencils), collated and stapled by half a dozen lifters and members.

If The Independent is to continue, and there's no reason it shouldn't in some shape or form, that kind of club spirit needs to be recaptured - or you may decide that the club doesn't need a newsletter as

such. That is a decision for the members and the club committee.

So, thank you to all the members who have contributed to, or supported, the newsletter over the past twenty years. It's been a good run and it was always my intention to pass on the torch before the publication became repetitive, uninteresting or irrelevant.

On the remaining pages of this issue, I've reproduced the front page of the very first issue of The Phoenix Independent plus a few that highlighted some landmark achievement, such as the club's first year anniversary, our first win of the Bob Edmond Shield at the Victorian Senior Championships, our victory at the Australian Club Championships and some Back Page Cartoons, acknowledging our guest cartoonists who took some of the pressure off me.

Best wishes to all our members, supporters and friends for 2024!

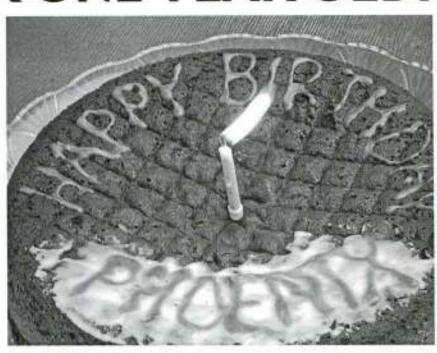
PHOENIX ONE YEAR OLD!

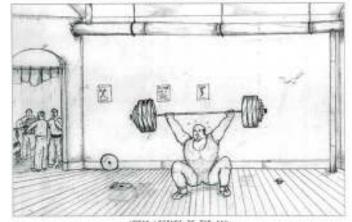

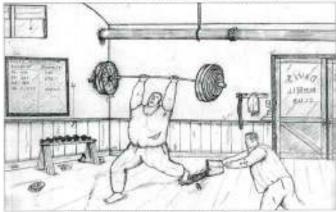

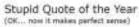
